The Parish Council has purchased a defibrillator at the request of Breton Park, Muxton.


It has been installed at Breton Park, adjacent to 2 Old Willow Road, and registered with the ambulance service.

DONNINGTON AND MUXTON NEIGHBOURHOOD PLANNING REFERENDUM RESULTS

Following the referendum on Thursday 27th January 2022, the Donnington and Muxton Neighbourhood Development Plan (DMNDP) obtained a majority vote in favour of making the DMNDP help decide planning applications in the Donnington and Muxton Neighbourhood Area.



Following this, a report was prepared for the 17th February Cabinet meeting, where the Local Authority were obliged to make the plan, allowing DMNDP to be given full weight in the determination of planning applications.

SATNAV ERROR



It has been identified that there is a SatNav error at the junction of Muxton Lane and Saltwells Drive.

The Parish Council has written to Telford and Wrekin Council's highways department, highlighting the problem, and the request for a SatNav Error sign has been logged onto Telford and Wrekin's system.

THE LIZ CLARE LIBRARY

Following extensive work to repair the damage to the library, we are happy to announce that we are now open! The Parish is excited to welcome back our community to the Liz Clare Library.

MESSAGE FROM THE CHAIRMAN

It has now been 9 months since I was elected Chairman of our Parish. In that time we have seen some big steps forward for our Parish Council.

In January we all went to the polls to vote on the local plan which was approved, although turnout was low. This will now force Telford & Wrekin Council to take the local plan into account when making big planning decisions in Donnington & Muxton. We hope that this will protect our green land.

The parish is currently receiving quotes in conjunction with Telford & Wrekin Council to resurface the path on the Saltwells Drive cut through as the path has become waterlogged, this should be a vast improvement.

Muxton is getting a war memorial thanks to the hard work of Cllr Lisa Dugmore who has for a number of years campaigned for a memorial to be placed within Muxton. This is long overdue and it is right that the people of Muxton have a place to pay their respects to our war heroes. We are expecting this to be completed by the end of the summer.

I am also proud to announce that the parish has awarded a new contract to our Christmas Light supplier, and the Parish will be receiving new Christmas lights. We are currently working out the best place for them.

Finally, the parish was unanimous in supporting the budget I proposed which has frozen council tax for another year. Something I was very keen on achieving.


BUS SHELTER REPLACEMENT, SCHOOL ROAD

Councillors have considered Telford & Wrekin Council's Bus Shelter Replacement Programme and offer of match funding for replacement shelters, and have resolved to replace the bus shelter opposite 65 School Road, Donnington as a matter of priority as part of the Bus Shelter Replacement Programme due to this bus shelter being in such a bad state of repair.

Investigation to what Parish Council owned bus shelters are currently on bus routes is being conducted in order to get those repaired also.
