Operation Clean Sweep

This Operation ran from Monday 2nd July to Friday 6th July 2007 inclusive. It was a highly successful Operation incorporating multi agency partners such as the Fire Brigade, the Wrekin Housing Trust, the Primary Care Trust (PCT), the Donnington Partnership, Telford and Wrekin Council (Environmental Health), the Vehicle Inspectorate, the Benefits Agency, the Sutherland School and the Asda superstore. During the Operation CSOs patrolled the area on foot between 0800 and 2200 hours alongside their police colleagues. The CSO Target Team were also utilised incorporating both foot and bicycle patrols. Donnington's Community Engagement Meetings had highlighted a perceived increase in the use of uninsured motor vehicles and of quad and small motorbikes to cause nuisance and anti social behaviour. This was addressed through the assistance of the Road Policing Team and the local ANPR (Automatic Number Plate Recognition) vehicle. A general briefing at the beginning of each day gave police and partner colleagues the chance to meet and understand both the overall objective of the Operation and the localised objectives of all agencies involved. Pupils from the local Sutherland School were involved in litter picking in support of the Operation and all partner agencies played their part. In terms of results, there were 14 arrests during the course of the Operation; 84 encounter forms and 30 intelligence reports submitted; 22 vehicles were seized and taken off the road; 30 fixed penalty notices were issued; and there was one seizure of an offensive weapon. Indeed, in numerical terms, it was the most successful of all similar operations run by the LPT at Donnington. Importantly, the general public of Donnington also received the operation well and offered much praise

to the Donnington Team. The Operation has since been held up as a "model" to be followed across the whole of Telford Division. PC Nikki Scott and her team put together a Powerpoint presentation outlining the Operation which has received praise when delivered at local PACT meetings and at "Neighbourhood Management" executive meetings within Telford and Wrekin Council. This Operation is only one initiative which evidences effective and widespread community engagement by the Donnington Team. It presented a clear reassurance model for the residents of Donnington - actioning community agreed priorities and providing tangible improvements to their quality of life. Further work carried out by the Team has enhanced this high level of community engagement.

Community Engagement through Citizenship within The Sutherland School

The Donnington LPT together with Donnington Partnership, decided to "Pilot" some engagement sessions, along the lines of the current adult PACT meetings, and incorporate them within the citizenship part of the school curriculum. The aim was to engage with an entire year group, split into 5 groups, and conduct mini PACT sessions to tease out concerns within their neighbourhood and school. 150 children took part in the sessions, which produced positive issues which the Partnership could take away and action. Many of these issues were also raised at the adult PACT meetings. Once actioned the results were fed back into the school, and were received very positively by the young people. So much so, that a Youth Forum has now evolved from some of the Young People who wish to continue working with the Donnington Partnership on a regular basis. They run their own forums within the school and then attend

and give input into the regular evening meetings generally attended by adults. This work has provided a permanent link between the Police, the school, the pupils and their parents, enabling those involved to contribute to the policing process and in turn improve the quality of their lives and the confidence within their community. Further to this, the Team has also dealt positively with local Persistent Young Offenders.

One in particular who was a prolific offender who targeted garages, outhouses and commercial outlets for both motorcycle and motor vehicle theft and in doing so caused



considerable anti social behaviour. All of this occurred within the Donnington LPT areas. It became a constant battle to thwart this individual, but these efforts were eventually realised when an ASBO (Anti Social Behaviour Order) was granted against him and he received a Youth Custody sentence of 8 months. Both of these results were brought about by teamwork, involving the Local LPT at Donnington, the Donnington Partnership, and the Vehicle Crime Squad at Malinsgate (DC Benjamin).

The main role players were not the Police, however, but the people of Donnington who felt confident enough to provide the LPT with statements about his anti-social behaviour and the effects it was having on their lives. Witnesses were only willing to provide this evidence once PC Scott, CSO Hall and CSO Bowen had spent sufficient time with them to reassure them that positive action would be taken. This support for the members of the Donnington community has continued on a daily basis since his arrest and subsequent conviction.

Through this continued hard work the LPT were successful in obtaining a further 2 year extension of his ASBO on attendance at court on 15th February 2008. This will provide further reassurance for the community in preparation for this individual's

return to the area in August 2008. Another Persistent Young Offender was an individual who thought nothing of continually disrupting the lives of residents in the Donnington area. He was unruly, and caused great alarm and distress to the elderly in the area who could not cope with his actions. On Friday 18th January 2008, at the tender age of 14, this young person was given an ASBO for 3 years. It was described by the Court as "a length of punishment unusual for someone so young". The sentence reflected the high level of anti social behaviour attributed to this young boy. The magistrates found the evidence compelling, and felt strongly that the residents of Donnington needed protecting, thus awarding the 3 year ASBO.

During the lengthy evidence gathering process there was a great deal of soul searching on behalf of the general public who initially were reluctant to "name and shame" this individual - largely because of his young age. However, after much reassurance and support from the Donnington LPT they came forward and provided vital evidence. Upon conviction, there was strong media interest in the young man which brought about regional TV interest. Local residents stood in front of cameras speaking of the frustrations, anger and upset they had suffered to the quality of their life. They now had their peace and quiet back.

As a result of the conviction, this young man, who is now in Local Authority care, has been found an "out of County" placement to give him and the residents a fresh start. Comparing figures from 1st January 2008 till present date with the same time scale in 2007, it is clear that this work has contributed towards a reduction in Anti Social Behaviour and a reduction in Criminal Damage on the Donnington area. This, in turn, has impacted positively on the figures for Telford as a whole.

More significantly, the impact of this work has also contributed towards a 31% reduction in Anti Social Behaviour during recent months, this being the greatest reduction across the Division. The residents of Donnington and Donnington Wood are still benefiting from the long term effects of it.

As well as impacting on figures, these three examples of involving a Community with an Operation; engaging effectively with the youth of the Community; and involving the Community with the prosecution of problematic individuals within the Community all illustrate how positively PC Scott, CSO Hall and CSO Bowen interact with each other, their Partners and, more importantly, with the Communities they serve.

Local History – Donnington Postcard

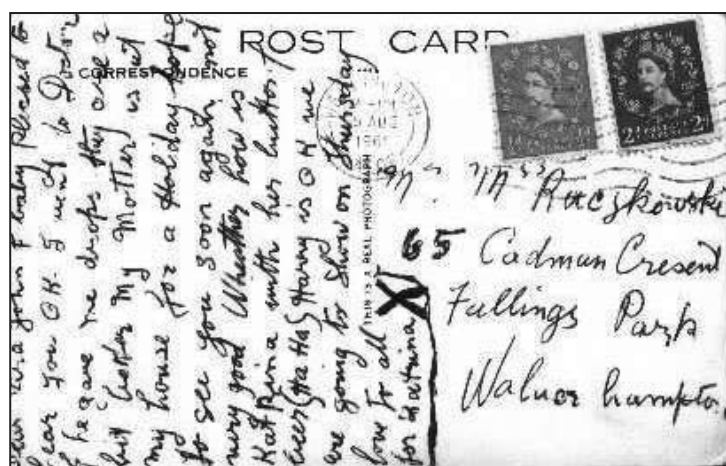
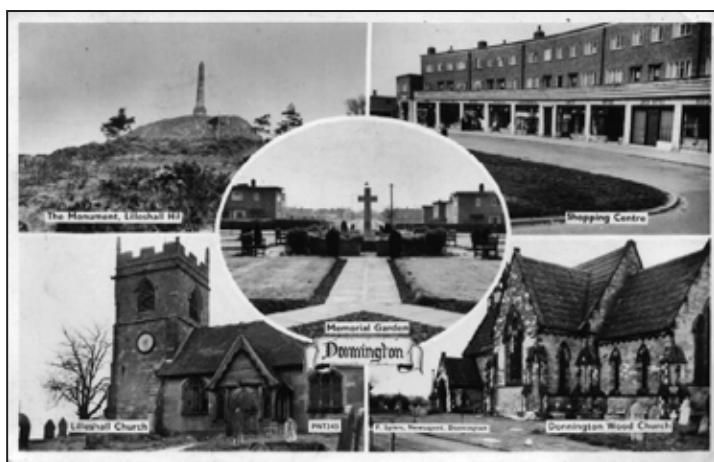
Apart from our line dance activities Alan Heighway is also very interested in Local History and one of our dancers brought in an old postcard featuring Donnington and the area for us to see. Unfortunately we cannot remember the lady's name and so are unable to give her a name check with the photo.

The postcard shows the monument on Lilleshall Hill top left corner, The Parade shops top right hand corner, Lilleshall church bottom left corner, Donnington Wood church bottom right corner, and the Memorial Gardens in the centre with a name credit to F Spiers, Newsagent, Donnington, who obviously sold the postcard locally. The

professionally made postcard means that Donnington must have been recognised as an important place that probably attracted a lot of visitors and the arrangement is typical of postcards produced at this time.

We can make out one of the names of the shops on the postcard as Jack Doyle, so it would be interesting if anyone who remembers the shops at this time could name some or all of the others or does any one remember F. Spiers the newsagent.....?....

Planning ahead for planning our parks

Telford and Wrekin Council recently appointed Halcrow Group to develop a Management Plan for Donnington Rec. The development of a Management Plan is an important process in looking at the long term future of this important park. This will take into account maintenance, management, future development and any issues around park usage.

As part of this overall process, public consultation is an important aspect of shaping the park's future. The consultants have already held a public session which was well attended and many of the issues affecting the park were raised. The park has also been audited for quality and value to the local community and a number of user surveys carried out.

The next stage is to hold a further session with the local community to update users on the progress of the Management Plan and any potential issues affecting the park. The real benefit of finalising the Management Plan allows the Council to seek funding, whether internally, externally or with partners to improve the park even further so local involvement is very important.

If you can't make the meetings, we would still value your input and we will happily send you a copy of the draft plan for you to comment on. At the same time we would value your views as park users and would be happy to send you the latest user survey to complete.

Quarterly Estate Walkabouts

FIREWORKS - legal note

The use of fireworks is now **prohibited** between the hours of 11pm and 7am in England and Wales, except Chinese New Year's Day, Diwali and New Year's Eve, when the permitted time is extended to 1am, and Bonfire Night when it is extended to midnight. Outside these dates and times, **penalties of up to £5,000 or 6 months in prison** can be imposed for breaching this curfew (the curfew is enforced by your local police).

The Fireworks Regulations 2004 also **prohibit anyone under the age of 18** from possessing fireworks (except fireworks professionals).

The misuse of fireworks may, in some circumstances, lead to the police issuing an anti-social behaviour order on the person creating 'harassment, alarm or distress' to their neighbours. Not complying with such an order carries a prison sentence of up to 5 years.

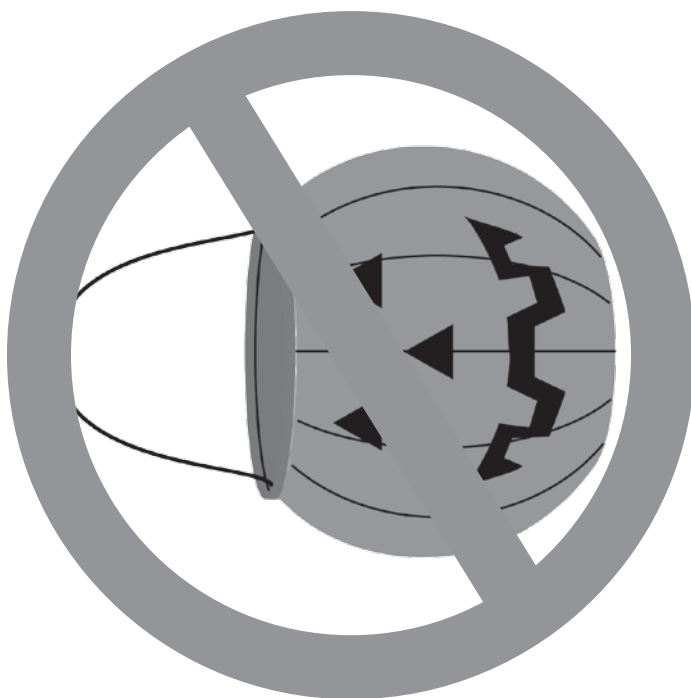
