# Loss of Donnington Willow Tree



As supermarket chain "Netto" has recently purchased the land where Donnington's Champion Jockey Public House once stood, it has become clear that the long established weeping willow tree on the site is destined to be felled.

Many local residents, including myself as a Telford Friends of the Earth (TelFoE) Member, had hoped that this majestic tree would be spared. I originally sought the Tree Preservation Order (TPO) when the pub was first vacated and I am deeply saddened that it now has to go. There is much local opinion that the willow should be retained and it will be missed greatly in the general treescape of the area. Despite best efforts from TelFoE and others which includes the Parish Council, it now looks unlikely that the willow will be saved.

# **Quarterly Estate Walkabouts**

The Wrekin Housing Trust has introduced a series of Estate Walkabouts every three months in response to tenant suggestions that regular inspections of their estates are carried out.

The Wrekin Housing Trust

Everyone is welcome to get involved in the walkabouts and residents can attend as many or as few as suits their commitments.

Walkabouts allow Trust officers and residents to work together to identify areas of concern that we are able to resolve, such as general external repairs, and to identify tenancy related issues which need attention.

The Trust will also be working closely with other agencies in the area to address issues such as litter, graffiti, vandalism, abandoned vehicles, road and pavement improvements and lighting.

The Donnington Walkabouts are currently well attended by our partner agencies, for example the Local Policing Team, and we would welcome support from residents. Residents who come out on the walkabouts will be 'rewarded' with coffee and biscuits after the walkabouts at the Trust office as a thank you for their time and effort.

# **Update: Donnington Wood Residents Survey**

The Wrekin Housing Trust recently handed out a number of Residents Surveys to tenants living in the Donnington Wood area to help to determine the basis of an Estate Agreement, drawn up by the Trust. The results from the survey highlighted a lot of positive things that residents feel about living in the Donnington Wood area. Convenience of public transport, access to the Lifelong Learning Centre and close proximity to shops were just a few of the many positives noted.

With this in mind, it has been agreed by the Donnington Partnership that as services to the estate were considered of a sufficient standard already, for the time being the Estate Agreement would be put to one side.

As a result of this, a Residents' Group will now be formed and it is hoped that regular meetings from the group will continue to resolve any issues that the local community may have. One

of the first things the newly formed Residents' Group will do is to look through the survey and identify the areas that need to be improved. However it is hoped that this empowerment of residents will help individuals to have a lot more say in the area in which they

- fireworks must not be let off after 11pm (extended to midnight on 5th November)
- children must always have adult supervision at firework and bonfire displays

# Parents / Grandparents needed

**Home-Start Telford & Wrekin**, an organisation which offers support to families with young children, is seeking volunteers with parenting experience. There are no age restrictions and no qualifications needed – we are looking for caring, non-judgemental people who are good listeners.

Home-Start Telford & Wrekin is a voluntary organisation which supports families throughout the region who have at least one child under the age of 5 and who are experiencing difficulties. The reasons for families needing support are varied but might include loneliness/isolation, disability, lack of support/contact with family or friends nearby, post natal depression, relationship problems, parenting issues, low self esteem, domestic abuse, multiple births or generally feeling low/depressed.

Home-Start helps families through home-visiting volunteers who visit once a week and offer support, friendship and sometimes a small amount of practical assistance. Volunteers need to have parenting experience and be caring and non-judgemental. There is a selection procedure and an initial 8 day training course plus on-going support and follow up training sessions as required. Volunteers can obtain NVQ accreditation through their Home-Start work.

There is a huge need for the kind of support that Home-Start offers and we need more volunteers so we can make a positive difference to the lives of more families. If you are interested in finding out more about becoming a Home-Start volunteer please contact the office on (01952) 201330






