Page 2 News in Brief

Clock Tower Roundabout

The Parish Council is delighted to see that, after many months, the clock on the ClockTower roundabout, Donnington has been repaired and is back to working order. This is a direct result of discussions held between the Parish Council and Telford & Wrekin Council ensuring funding was made available to repair the clock.

Parish Precept

A precept is an authoritative order to a billing authority (in this case Telford & Wrekin Council) to pay the Parish/Town Council a named sum of money. At a meeting held in January this Parish Council decided to keep the Precept for the year 2010/2011 the same as the last two years at £187,000. This will mean a reduction of 63p per elector in the Parish Council element of the Council Tax.

Pensioners Vouchers

This year approximately 1,130 £5 vouchers were distributed by this Council to pensioners residing within the parish prior to Christmas 2009. Once again this is up on the previous total for Christmas 2008 as they continue to become increasingly popular.

Grant Awards

At a meeting held last November, the Parish Council awarded a total of £3,050 to organisations from in and around the parish. To discover if your group or organisation is eligible to apply for a grant from this Council, then please contact the Clerk at the Parish Office.

Donnington Recreation Ground/Broadoaks Playing Field


This Parish Council has set up a working group with

Telford & Wrekin Council to finalise the management plan and prioritise financial resources for the improvements at the Donnington Recreation Ground and the Broadoaks Playing Field. The group is currently working on obtaining additional funding to continue implementing the management plan through 2010. It is hoped to see improvements commencing on the Recreation Ground around the latter part of the year. However, plans are well under way to provide a BMX track on the Broadoaks Playing Field. It is hoped that this will be installed around July or August dependant on the planning process. Proposed plans for the improvements to Donnington Recreation Ground are available to see by appointment at the Parish Council office.

Quarterly Estate Walkabouts

The Wrekin Housing Trust has introduced a series of Estate Walkabouts every three months in response to tenant suggestions that regular 'inspections' of their estates are carried out.

Everyone is welcome to get involved in the Walkabouts and residents can attend as many or as few as suits their commitments.

Walkabouts allow Trust officers and residents to work together to identify areas of concern that we are able to resolve, such as general external repairs and identify tenancy related issues, which need attention. The Trust will also be working closely with other agencies in the area to address issues such as litter, graffiti, vandalism, abandoned vehicles, road and pavement improvements and lighting.

The Donnington walkabouts are currently well attended by our partner agencies, for example, the Local Policing team, and we would welcome support from residents. Residents who come out on the walkabouts will be 'rewarded' with coffee and biscuits after the walkabouts at the Trust office as a thank you for their time and effort.

Pothole Buster Campaign

As I am are sure you are aware, the recent cold spell has meant that there are many more potholes on the public roads of Telford and Wrekin.

We know from the feedback received from our partners, particularly Parish and Town Councils, that the condition of the public roads is a main priority for people in the borough.

In response to this from Monday February 1, we are launching our Pothole Buster initiative which actively encourages the public to report the location of potholes so that the Council can fix them. We will make safe all dangerous potholes reported by the end of the next working day.

To ensure the success of this initiative the Council is significantly increasing resources to deal with the potholes. The Council is putting on an extra three teams to help us concentrate solely on pothole filling. We aim to double the amount of potholes we fill every week from around 150 to around 300.

The public can notify us of the whereabouts of potholes:

- 24 hours a day online at www.telford. gov.uk/potholebusters by completing a short report form and giving details of the pothole's location.
- Calling the Pothole Busters on **01952 384000** from 8am to 7pm on weekdays to report the pothole.

All potholes reported will be identified and

their severity. Those identified as dangerous will be repaired by the end of the next working day. You can find a definition of a dangerous pothole at www.telford.gov.uk/potholebusters.

We hope you can help our campaign by actively getting as many reports to us and encouraging the public to become Pothole Busters. We do have our street inspectors out every day but with the help of the public the Council will be able to identify many more potholes.

Expect this campaign to run until the early spring, when we will review the situation.

We will be back in touch with you with some further campaign material that you may wish to use to support and help publicise the campaign for the benefit of all the residents of Telford and Wrekin.

Lilleshall Village Tennis Club has received grant aid from Sports Unlimited to fund Mini Tennis coaching lessons, led by an LTA qualified coach, for pupils at Lilleshall School. Sessions are currently held for the school children at the Talbot Centre Tennis Courts in the village every Wednesday between 2pm and 3pm and between 3.30 pm and 4.30 pm.

Mini tennis is great fun and designed to encourage children with little or no experience to learn to play the game of tennis. Tennis racquets, balls and activities are geared to the suit their age and capabilities.

The Tennis Club is proposing to initiate a new Junior membership to provide mini tennis sessions, commencing in April 2010 for all children in the area. A fully qualified, LTA licensed coach is available. It is planned to hold Mini Tennis Sessions at the Talbot Centre, Lilleshall, on Thursdays from April 2010, between 4.00 pm and 6.00 pm.




Feel The Beat

Lilleshall Hill and Monument 1908

Lilleshall Hill has been a local and historic landmark seen many for many years. Sometimes it is great to be able to take a look back and see what time has done to evolve the village that nestles at the foot of the hill. It is true to say that farming has always been one of the strongest features of the area and this is one of the reasons a lot more people settled there midway between the developing town of Newport and the Army connections at Donnington. However, if we could turn the clock back around 100 years ago say to 1908 and visit the hill, its residents were situated at the lowest region of the hill and apparently quite far apart. I came across this old postcard posted in Kidderminster to a Mrs B. P. Thomas at Bridlewood Cottage, Hatton, Nr Shifnal Salop (I still favour Salop and what it stands for) which quite clearly shows the area well underdeveloped in comparison to today. What is noticeable is that the footpath to the monument is well trodden even then. How the countryside view from the top must have changed since then.

Keeping the Neighbourhood Safe





Want to do something different? Want to raise money where you live or work? Want to eat Fish and Chips, while raising money for charity? Hold a fish and chip supper on Friday 21st May 2010 whilst raising awareness of spinal cord injury and supporting SIA's information and support services.

You can hold a fish and chip supper in your own home, at work or hold a larger supper at your local community centre.

SIA will provide a fundraising pack containing hints and tips, recipes, invitations and donation envelopes. By inviting seven friends and asking them to donate an additional £5 you will raise at least £35 from your supper but we will also give you additional fundraising ideas to raise even more money for SIA.

Last year we had over 80 suppers taking part in England and Wales. In 2010 we want to double that figure and ensure we can provide more support to spinal cord injured people.

The money raised from the suppers will help the Spinal Injuries Association offer support to individuals who become paralysed and their families, from the moment a spinal injury occurs, and for the rest of

their lives by providing services and publications which enable and encourage paralysed people to lead independent lives.

Every year in the UK over 1,000 people experience a spinal cord injury and there are an estimated 40,000 spinal cord injured people in the UK alone.

Community Fundraising Officer, Elizabeth Wright. says, "The Fish and Chip Supper is a wonderful opportunity for a great evening with friends and family. We are also encouraging people who work to hold a Fish and Chip Lunch in their work places to raise even more funds. You may be even a local community group wanting to run a fun evening with your group.
