# Parish Council - standing as a candidate

Have you ever thought of having a say in the decision making process that influences your community? If so, why not stand for election as a Parish Councillor in the forthcoming elections on 5th May 2011.

To stand for election to a Parish or Town Council, there are a number of criteria that you must meet.

Full details can be found on the Electoral Commission website.

In short, to qualify to be a candidate for a local election, on the day of nomination and on the day of the election you must be:

- aged 18 years or over
- and either a UK or Commonwealth citizen, or a citizen of the Irish Republic, or a citizen of a member state of the EU.

## In addition, you must meet at least one of the following:

- on the day of nomination and on the day of the election you are and thereafter you continue to be registered as a voter in the Parish
- for the whole of twelve months before the day of nomination and the day of the election you have occupied any land or other premises as owner or tenant in the Parish
- for the whole of twelve months before the day of nomination and the day of the election your principal or only place of work has been in the Parish
- for the whole of twelve months before the day of nomination and the day of the election you have resided in the Parish or within three miles of it

#### You will be unable to be elected and to serve as a Councillor if:

- you are a paid employee of the Parish
- you are subject to a bankruptcy restrictions order
- you have within five years, before the day of the election, been sentenced to a term of imprisonment (whether suspended or not) of not less than three months without the option of a fine

Under related downloads you can access a selection of forms and documents that a candidate would need to complete to enable you to stand for a Parish or Town Council election.

#### **Allotments**

Documents regarding the lease of land in Donnington and sale of the Lilleshall site are now with the Parish Council's Solicitors. When these documents have been finalised and signed (hopefully this will have been completed by the time this newsletter is distributed) then a planning application for the Donnington site will be submitted to Telford & Wrekin Council for change of use to allotments. Once permission and funding has been granted, work will commence on the sites to comply with planning consent. It is not known how long all these processes will take but the Parish Council is hopeful that the allotments will be opened in the second quarter of 2011 barring any setbacks.

#### **Parish Council Change of Name**

As a result of the Community Governance Review recently undertaken on this Parish Council an Order was made stating that as from 1<sup>st</sup> December 2010 the Council will become known as **Lilleshall**, **Donnington and Muxton Parish Council**. As from this date the Parish Council web site address will be available at www.ldmpc.org

#### **Sensory Garden**

Work is now well underway on the Chairman's project for a Sensory Garden to be located at Barclay Gardens, Donnington and grant funding of £1,000 toward the costs of setting this up has also been received from Fair Share Trust. It is planned to provide benches, raised beds, "bug hotels", plants and fruit trees from which members of the public and children will benefit. The work is being undertaken by the Greenwood Trust and Green Gym who have helped create the Sensory Garden in Lawley. It is planned to work with the local schools in giving on-site education lessons to children about various aspects of nature.



#### Pensioners' Vouchers

Last Christmas 1,063 pensioners residing within the parish boundary collected the Christmas vouchers provided by the Parish Council.

### **Donnington Recreation Ground**

Consultations have been ongoing between this Parish Council and Telford & Wrekin Council with regard to improvements to Donnington Recreation Ground. The main aim of these discussions is to implement the Management Plan for the area which was undertaken two years ago. The Plan is aimed at improving the facilities and look of the Recreation Ground with children and young people in mind.

Due to funding, new facilities will be introduced over the coming years commencing with an improved ball court and better/new apparatus within the children's play area. This will then be followed by a skate park.

The **ball court** proposed for the Donnington Recreation Ground has recently been granted planning approval. The order has now been placed and it is anticipated that it should be complete by the end of February.

The **play area** was delayed due to the weather but is nearing completion and should be completed by the time this newsletter has been published. Unfortunately, the graphics will not be put in until the weather has improved.

A consultation with the skateboarders has already taken place and funding for the **skate park** has been secured from Fair Share Trust (Via Donnington Partnership).

Our thanks go to Derek Owen (T&W) for all his hard work organising contracts, obtaining funding and dealing with all the issues regarding the above.

## Certificate of Higher Education

The Parish Clerk has recently successfully completed the Certificate in Higher Education in Community Engagement and Governance in conjunction with the University of Gloucestershire.

#### **Councillor Surgeries**

Over the last number of years attendance at the Councillor Surgeries run by this Parish Council has been extremely poor. This may be due to modern communication methods whereby the electorate can contact the Parish Council through email or via its web-site. As a result, this Council will no longer be holding Councillor Surgeries.

#### Bus Shelter, St George's Road

A new bus shelter has been installed on St George's Road, near to the "Four Ways" junction opposite the brick bus shelter. This is as a result of requests received from local residents.

### **Parish Housing Need Survey**

A survey asking residents for opinions on housing needs within the rural areas of this Parish Council will be delivered as part of a consultation exercise being undertaken by Telford & Wrekin Council and this Council. Residents in the rural areas of Lilleshall and Muxton are asked to complete these surveys as they will ultimately affect how developments in your area are considered in the future.

# Donnington Local Policing Team This is the Local Policing Team that serves you.







Meet your Local Policing Team for Donnington that are committed to improve your quality of life for the area you live and work.

As a Local Policing Team we provide reassurance patrols in the area. Whilst on our patrols we deal with a range of quality of life issues which affect the community in Donnington. This could be with regard to nuisance neighbours, crime, Anti Social Behaviour and tackling nuisance.

We also visit schools in the area to provide talks on safety, including internet safety, the STAR drugs programme and bullying. We provide support and information to residents on any issues they may raise, this could include personal safety, crime prevention and vehicle crime.

# How do we tackle Anti-Social Behaviour? A) Early Intervention

We deal with Anti Social Behaviour by using Early Intervention Measures. We send Anti Social Behaviour Letters, and also visit parents, advising them what their son/daughter has been involved in and what will happen if the young person continues to cause Anti Social Behaviour in the community. The Donnington Local Policing Team look at different strategies to prevent the behaviour continuing, this could be joint meetings with parents, bringing agencies onboard to work with the young person or looking at Acceptable Behaviour Contracts (ABCs) and Anti Social Behaviour Orders. By using the intervention model this has helped many young people change their behaviour and understand the harm they are causing in the community and the impact it has. Residents who are affected by the Anti Social Behaviour can have their quality of life restored.

### B) Working with others / Joint work

To help work alongside us we work very closely with the Donnington Partnership. The Partnership consists of many partner agencies from Local Authority, housing, education and Parish Council (as well as local resident representatives).

As a group we coordinate a range of activities and actions to help resolve your issues and concerns. These are often raised and actioned at Community Engagement Meetings (also known as PACT meetings – Partners and Communities Together). We then address your issues and report back at future meetings. Since Partnership Community Engagements Meetings have been running in Donnington we have had successes with the following.

- Incidents of Anti Social Behaviour including trespassing on properties, criminal damage to vehicles, use of illegal motorbikes, under age drinking.
- 2) Speeding traffic
- 3) Vandalism to areas in Donnington i.e. parks
- 4) Condition of roads and pavements
- 5) Irresponsible parking

Over the recent months as a Local Policing team, we have tackled Anti Social Behaviour in areas which experienced a high number of Anti Social Behaviour incidents. This required working alongside members of the Donnington Partnership and local residents in order to help reduce the problems. A number of actions took place resulting in young people causing the Anti Social Behaviour being dealt with robustly.

An alleyway at the centre of the anti social behaviour is also to be temporary gated. With the Partnership work that took place incidents reduced and restored to residents the quality of life they are entitled to.

### C) Bringing back Community Spirit

Residents of the area then wished to come together as a street and expressed a wish to generate and bring back some community spirit. To help them come together we organised for TCAT (Telford College) to come in and do a series of workshops. This proved successful in building relationships between several residents and service providers.

Part of this was to improve awareness of house fires in the home, and promote the use of smoke alarms. Donnington has experienced a number of fires in the area.

To help raise the community's awareness of the danger of fires and about fire safety and working

smoke alarms a house fire demonstration was planned in an empty property with the support of Wrekin Housing Trust. The demonstration was very well supported, with the attendance of over 300 people, which resulted in high take up of smoke alarms and home safety checks.

Another success is that over recent months we have carried out drug warrants on properties for which we as a team have received information on supplying drugs in and around the Donnington area. From using this information, we have successfully dealt with people for supplying and cultivating drugs in the Donnington area.

Together with Donnington Partnership, Donnington Local Policing Team have projects underway and are currently robustly dealing with the use of illegal motorbikes in the area.

#### So to summarise ...

# What's good about Donnington Local Policing Team and its work with Donnington Partnership?

- There is good communication between organisations, community groups and local residents. This helps to prevent duplication or the wasting of resources on something that has been tried and not worked.
- The pooling of ideas and sharing of resources makes it possible for complex problems to be resolved, and also can trigger a bigger and better response to an idea or problem raised because more people know about it. The collective strength that can come from working together in solving a problem can achieve results that would have been beyond one agency working alone.
- Reliable intelligence and information enable the partners to "get it right first time" when finding solutions to problems
- Working together seems to help partners take a more proactive response instead of individually tending to be more reactive.

Finally, by working together, and operating the public sessions that we do, we can far more easily communicate this out to the community and continue to develop and find new ways of working.

# Planning to have a Street Party to celebrate the Queen's Diamond Jubilee in 2012?

If you are considering holding a street party to celebrate the Queen's Diamond Jubilee in 2012 then you may be required to obtain a temporary road closure for these events at a small fee set by Telford & Wrekin Council.

As a result of feedback provided to Telford & Wrekin Council by previous event organisers it has revised its procedures to provide clearer guidance to event organisers on what they need to do when planning an event and has amended its charging system which means smaller events will have reduced charges compared to the current charging system.

The key information points are:

- There will continue to be no charge for Remembrance Day Parades organised through a parish/town council: charges will apply to other highway closure requests.
- The charges will vary according to the type of organisation applying and the size of the event.
- The notice period required to progress highway closures will be a minimum of 12 weeks prior to the date of the planned event (this will be strictly enforced). This is the same notice period Telford & Wrekin Council currently requires.
- As with existing arrangements the charges cover the administration and advertising costs associated with highway closures, but do not include the physical traffic management (i.e. cones, barriers) that may be required.
- All the necessary information, along with a downloadable form, is available from the Telford & Wrekin Council website (www.telford.gov.uk/roadclosures).

Please note the highway is not just the road. If you are planning an event that will close a footpath, verge or bridleway you should apply for a closure. If it is taking place on the highway, but doesn't require a closure (for example if it is on the footpath but pedestrians can still pass freely), you will still need to notify traffic@telford.gov.uk that the event is taking place.

# Fly Tipping

Fly tipping is not only unsightly and illegal but costs you the taxpayer in excess of £250,000 per year to remove and dispose of. We have around 320 incidents reported every month amounting to over 1500 tonnes of waste per year. Fly tipping can also attract other antisocial behaviour activities such as vandalism and graffiti.

If you have waste to get rid of make sure you give it to a person who is authorised to do so. If you give your waste to someone who is not, and they dump it, you could be fined up to £5000. Ask for their Waste Carriers registration number – if they cannot supply one do not give them your waste. If you are not sure you can check with the Environment Agency 08708 506506.

The council can help both rural and urban communities in stamping out this problem but we need help from the community. To be successful in stopping fly tippers the council requires good accurate reports, particularly descriptions of individuals and vehicle number plates, of any witnessed fly tips. Remember, the more information the better, so please try and provide as many details as possible.
