The Annual Return for the year ended 31st March 2011 has been concluded and signed off by the auditors, Mazars LLP. It is their opinion the annual return is in accordance with proper practices and no matters have come to their attention giving cause for concern that relevant legislation and regulatory requirements have not been met.

Newsletters

The Parish Council has changed the way in which future newsletters will be made available. Newsletters will still be available to view via the Parish Council's website www. ldmpc.org but will not be delivered to every household within the parish. Instead, newsletters will be placed in the library, dentists, medical centres, community halls, churches, schools, post office, Lifelong Learning Centre and the Parish Council office. Should any resident wish to have a hard copy of the newsletter then this can be obtained by contacting the Parish Clerk on 608001. It is estimated that the Parish Council will save approximately £5,000 over a year using this method.

Cycling on Footpaths

Complaints have been received about cyclists using the footpaths especially in the area of Coronation Drive and School Road, Donnington. Elderly residents have been knocked over and injured. The Parish Council would like to remind cyclists that under section 72 of the Highways Act 1835 it is an offence to ride a bicycle on a pavement and the police have assured the Parish Council that offenders will be spoken to and, if necessary, issued with a fixed penalty notice. Please cycle responsibly.

Lilleshall Primary School

The Parish Council would like to welcome the new head teacher of Lilleshall Primary School, Christobel Cousins and wish her well in her post. The Council looks forward to working with her in the future.

Wellington Road, Muxton

Complaints are constantly being received with regard to vehicles speeding along Wellington Road, Muxton. As a result, the Safer Roads Partnership will be collecting data over the forthcoming months the outcome of which will be discussed and actioned as necessary. The Police have also informed the Parish Council that they will continue to carry out random speed checks at this location.

Donnington Recreation Ground

A planning application has now been submitted to Telford & Wrekin Council for the skate park on the recreation ground. If permission is granted then work is expected to commence in the New Year and it is hoped to have an official opening combined with a community fun day in the summer.

Allotments

Lilleshall allotments are now finally open and plot holders have been working hard to personalise their own plots. Work on the Donnington site has begun and it is hoped that these will be open toward the end of October.

Food Waste Recycling

Residents in certain areas of the borough and this parish have been taking part in a food waste collection trial since October 2010. The aim of the trial has been to establish likely tonnages and calculate how much a borough wide food waste collection would cost.

On average just over 30% of households in the trial area have been taking part which is, unfortunately, well below the level that would make food waste collections viable. Therefore the trial will end shortly.

The trial has provided Telford & Wrekin Council with the valuable information on how a food waste collection scheme could be rolled out in the future and data collected from the trial will contribute to the development of the Councils Kerbside Contract which is due for renewal in 2014.

Lilleshall Monumental Race March 27th 2011

Newport and District running club, together with a small group of Lilleshall residents, known locally as 'Mums on the Run' are delighted to report for a second year 'running' a hugely successful race! The organising team had several objectives which included:

- involving the whole of our community
- raising awareness of health and exercise for all
- developing a follow up phase to promote running further with school children in Lilleshall and perhaps more widely within the Newport cluster.

Most importantly, the overall objective was for an enjoyable day for everyone taking part in the Monumental Race.

Building on the experience of their first race in 2010, the group approached various organisations for financial backing and were thrilled to gain this support from the local Parish Council, Lilleshall Residents' Association, and Telford and Wrekin Council.

The organising team felt it essential to recognise the endeavours of all participants and acknowledge their personal achievements on the day in order to encourage participants to continue with sport and fitness. The finances received enabled us to provide over 300 entrants with a high quality 'goodie bag' to mark their achievement, as well as allowing us to provide health promotion information to all participants.

Specially printed race numbers for all runners were purchased and this permitted the race to run smoothly and give a 'serious event feel', in particular for those who entered the fun run. Great excitement was evident as individuals eagerly awaited the results of both the 10k race and fun run being published on the Newport and District Running Club's web site.

The grants also enabled the organisers to purchase an engraved plate for the first child to finish from each year group for children aged 5 - 14, this again provided great motivation for our young runners.

Community engagement was fundamental to the success of the event and the team were overwhelmed with the offers of support and help received from local residents and running club members. There was a sense of real partnership and warmth at work, and reports of great enjoyment by the encouraging marshals who said their participation had given them a wonderful sense of 'village belonging'.

As a result of grants provided for this project, as well as the money raised from the Monumental Race, Newport and District Running Club are delighted to now donate £1,300 to Lilleshall Cricket Club to refurbish the kitchen area. The cricket club is used by the local community for family evenings and as a 'before and after school club' and so these improvements will be of great benefit to the wider community.

We have also been able to invest in equipment to enable us to put on a bigger and better race in 2012.

Finally, we have been able to fund a follow up phase of the Monumental project. This is an exciting and innovative development and will enable us to engage with our Primary school and others within the Newport cluster to develop sustainable ways of promoting running to improve the fitness, health and well being of our young people.

Major thanks go to all those who contributed in any way no matter how small their input may have seemed. It is as a result of collective efforts, that we have achieved the success we now celebrate and look forward to sustaining and developing the successes of the Lilleshall Monumental in the future.

An update from the Donnington Partnership

Thanks to the last edition of the Lilleshall, Donnington and Muxton Parish Council newsletter the Donnington Partnership have successfully recruited two new local volunteers who will be helping the organisation and its projects move forward to improve the quality of life for people living and working in the Donnington area.

BUT....we still need more! This time we are looking for a person to fulfil the very specific and important role of minutes secretary.

The main purpose of the role is to attend the Partnership's meetings and support the Chair in ensuring the smooth functioning of meetings by recording minutes and actions from those meetings. There are currently 10 Partnership meetings that you would be required to attend each year and these occur during the daytime, Monday to Friday.

Personal qualities that you need:

- Adequate time to perform this role
- Good time-keeping
- Possess word processing skills with Microsoft Word
- An ability to work on your own

Further information about the Donnington Partnership:

Donnington Partnership is a registered charity with a board of 4 volunteer Trustees working with 11 committee members made up of representatives from local agencies, service providers and authorities, residents and local community groups. Donnington Partnership has often been cited in the Borough as a good model for partnership working. It formed in 1995 and in 2010 became a registered charity.

Some of our successes

- It runs a volunteer managed community café providing affordable healthy meals daily during term-time as well as outside catering services
- It runs a volunteer-led garden tool lending library
- It runs a volunteer-led toy lending library
- We gained £15k towards events and monthly activities that will begin when the new Skate park is built on Donnington Rec.
- We gained £25k to put measures in place at Granville Park to prevent criminal damage and make it a safer and attractive place to visit.
- We helped finance facilities for mobile CCTV cameras at the Parade, Winifred's Drive, Ash Lea Drive, Coronation Drive and Park Road
- We ran campaigns and gained funding towards getting a Puffin crossing installed on Wellington Rd and the road re-surfaced behind the Parade shops.
- We obtained funds to employ a visual artist to work in 2 secondary schools on a project about the effects of alcohol misuse on young lives and make a DVD resource for educational use.



Community Action Against Crime: Innovation Fund

The fund will encourage effective partnerships to get everybody working together to tackle crime. It will be used to encourage voluntary and community groups to work with their community safety partnership to tackle local crime problems, including through co-design and co-delivery of initiatives to cut crime. Applications from grassroots community activists who are not traditional recipients of government grants are encouraged.

Community action against crime: Innovation fund is funded by the Home Office and delivered by the Community Development Foundation (CDF).

Criteria

The following criteria will be used to make funding decisions. All applications must show that they:

- are innovative
- deliver lasting benefit
- have involved local communities
- tackle crime issues that matter to the local community, with a particular focus on antisocial behaviour, crime in local neighbourhoods, drug/alcohol related crime, reducing re-offending, violence against women and girls, and youth crime.

While we do not want to dictate how projects are delivered, we will award additional credit to applications that can demonstrate that they meet the following desirable criteria:

- partnership working between the voluntary and community sector, and the local community safety partnership, or one of its constituent statutory agencies
- partnership working between the voluntary and community sector and local private sector organisations. This could be through joint project working, or through match-funding (in cash, time, or goods and services provided without payment as a public service)
- local community involvement in the design or the delivery of the project.

The fund is open for applications from 05 September 2011 to 01 December 2011.

You can apply for funding between £1,000 and £15,000 per year.

Or between £15,001 and £50,000.
